SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Marian Baker School (MBS) is a private international English-speaking school educating preschool through high school students. There are fourteen different nationalities represented among teachers and students. Total enrollment (K-12) of 162 students with an average secondary school class size of 8. This year we have 10 seniors, which makes classes more personalized.

CURRICULUM

The Marian Baker School is fully accredited by the Costa Rican Ministry of Public Education (MEP) and the AdvancED (SACS-CASI). MBS is also authorized to offer the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme in the 11th and 12th grade levels. Students graduating from MBS receive the Costa Rican National Diploma (Bachillerato), the U.S. High School Diploma and the IB Diploma.

The school year at MBS runs from August to June. The school day begins at 8:00 a.m. and ends at 3:09 p.m. with a total of 35 class periods of 50 minutes each. Marian Baker students may graduate with the IB Diploma, US High School Diploma, and the Costa Rican Bachillerato. Grading is based on the IB academic guidelines

STUDENT LIFE

The school offers a rich extracurricular program. Students in Grades 9–12 have a rich variety of co-curricular opportunities, including theater, band, photography, public speaking, among others. Students have the opportunity to take part in Model United Nations, National Honor Society, Student Government and AASCA leadership. As a member of AASCA, students are allowed to participate in soccer, basketball, volleyball, and cross-country tournaments competing in local and international events with fellow AASCA schools.

GRADING SYSTEM

GPA is based on a 4.0 points scale with the exception of DP classes which are weighted. The GPA provided in the transcript is cumulative from 9th to 12th grade courses. Core subjects are annual and weight 1 credit. Electives and PE are semester courses that weigh 0.5 credits each course.

Diploma Programme students receive grades ranging from 7 to 1, with 7 being highest. Costa Rican Social Studies and Civics are graded on a scale from 1-100. Due to the small class size we do not provide a rank.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

GTo earn the US High School Diploma, students must have obtained an average of 3/7 in the DP at the end of the two years and a minimum of 26 credits. In addition, the students need to complete the Extended Essay, the CAS requirements, and the Theory of Knowledge.

All assessment requirements for the IB Diploma are externally evaluated or moderated by the IBO. In order to receive The Costa Rican National Baccalaureate (MEP), students are required to take national standardized exams in Costa Rican Social Studies and Civics in addition to the IB Exams in their corresponding subject areas.
