





Scholarship programs

The annual tuition is US **\$8,417** for every grade level (from kindergarten to 12th grade).

Humboldt Schule has a scholarship fund financed by the German government and by contributions from parents. This scholarship fund removes the financial barrier quality education to experienced by many underprivileged students. The amount of financial aid a student receives depends on their level, academic socioeconomic performance and conduct.

Cultural Experience & Exchange Programs

As a multicultural school, Humboldt Schule seeks to educate its students in different cultures. Our school focuses on a solid impartation of classes in three languages (German, Spanish & English) and an objective representation of Germany and Costa Rica and the U.S.

During the summer of the 10th grade, there's a mandatory foreign exchange trip with schools in Germany. Students embark on this journey alongside their entire class, accompanied by six to eight teachers (1:10 student teacher ratio). This exchange program spans two weeks, encompassing various regions of Germany such as Berlin and Leipzig. Additionally, two weeks are spent in guest homes while attending school in different towns such as Munich, Augsburg, Stuttgart, and Ansbach. In February of the following year, the German exchange students come to Costa Rica and stay with their previous houseguests.

In addition to the German exchange program, we also offer the opportunity for a group of around 25 students to go to New York for two 2 weeks. During this trip, we visit New York City and then spend a week and a half with students from Shaker High School in Albany, New York. This trip is not obligatory, yet this immersion experience is a great way for them to learn about the culture in the United States.



Facilities

Without a doubt, the Humboldt Schule is one of the best-equipped schools in the country. This applies to all of its modern information technology equipment, such as: smart boards, iPads, laptops, science laboratories, and sports facilities, including a 25-meter-long swimming pool. Since the year 2000, the school has its own cultural center where all the art, music and industrial arts lessons are taught.

Sustainability

Sustainability is a big concern at Humboldt Schule. The vegetable garden on the premises teaches students how to grow and care for their own fruits, vegetables and herbs. The solar panels installed provide the majority of the energy used including the heating of the swimming pool. Recycling and reutilizing are concepts ingrained in the children from a young age and disposal of garbage is organized accordingly throughout the school.





Covid-19 Response

On March 8th, 2020, Humboldt Schule closed its doors to students due to the Covid-19 pandemic. After a day-long teacher training, the school began full-time classes via ZOOM on March 10th until December 10th, 2020. During this time, students continued online learning with the same rigorous schedule as they had had at school. The teachers and students were equipped with tablets and laptops.

The students from first to ninth grade were given specific projects instead of exams, and the tenth, eleventh and twelfth grades wrote all of their exams online via ZOOM. The Sprachdiplom (the German language diploma), the Zentrale Klassenarbeiten (10th grade achievement exams), and the final Abitur oral exams took place at school in October and November.

For the 2021 school year, we taught using a hybrid classroom format in which we had two groups of students who alternated coming to school every other week. At the beginning of 2022, only 4% of our students were learning virtually, while the rest had returned to in-person lessons.


