UWC (United World Colleges) is a global education movement consisting of 18 campuses on 5 continents that makes education a force to unite people, nations, and cultures for peace and a sustainable future.

Opened in 2006 as the only UWC in Central and South America, UWC Costa Rica evolved from the pre-existing SOS International College Hermann Gmeiner, developing the SOS Children's Villages Association. In recognition of our unique heritage, UWC Costa Rica is committed to retaining an SOS ethos and offering scholarships to students with SOS backgrounds each year.

UWC Costa Rica is an international, fully residential boarding school. 212 students come from a variety of academic, socioeconomic, cultural, and language backgrounds. They represent 67 different countries:

Earning a placement at a UWC is an extremely competitive process, requiring exceptional academic performance, a multi-tiered interview system, and multiple recommendations. We know that every one of our students possesses the capacity for academic achievement and incredible community impact. All students begin high school studies in their home country before enrolling at UWC Costa Rica. Once at UWC, all students complete the **IB Diploma Program.** Students are limited to three subjects at Higher Level (HL) and three at Standard Level (SL).

Residential & Co-Curricular Life

UWC Costa Rica is a 2-year residential experience. All students live on campus and are expected to be fully involved in academic, residential, and co-curricular life. Living and learning with students of different cultures and backgrounds is a central feature of the school.

We offer a rich co-curricular program that reflects a commitment to balancing Creativity, Action, and Service (CAS). Our community action expectations go well beyond IB CAS requirements.

Key co-curricular programs include "Getting to Know Costa Rica" trips, Community Action Week, Global Affairs sessions, Model United Nations, Spectrum (queer community safe space), Cultural Weeks, Dance, Crossfit, Yoga, Creative Cooking. These activities foster the relationship with communities and organizations in Costa Rica.



The other 19% plan to pursue an incredible array of gap year experiences, ranging from national service to education internships to Semester at Sea and Global Citizen Year to immediate placement in the workforce, among other things. After their gap year plans, these students plan to attend university within 1-2 years.



Each year, we limit our students to 10 applications total across the globe. In this calculation, UCAS and Stuvvdielink each constitute one application.

Additionally, starting with the Class of 2023, they will be limited to 2 Early Action applications to which they may apply on top of 1 Early Decision.

Our aim by limiting applications in these ways is that our students spend more time researching and prioritizing the universities that are most important to them.

This year, our CAS office seeks to promote quality over quantity and thus decided to limit the number of CAS specific activities and only allow students to serve as the official leader for one CAS activity.

Future Pathways statement on standarized testing

As the global trend continues to favor test-optional admission practices, we have seen a significant decrease in interest from our students in taking either the SAT/ACT. Additionally, since ACT went digital in 2018, there are no test centers for ACT in Costa Rica. For those students who choose to test while they are on campus, we provide support to do so, but we believe that test score reporting rests on the individual student and there is no need to report aggregate scores from a small sample size here as it does not reflect our students abilities and contributions to their future universities.
